## **Seasonal Care**

<b>Spring</b> Loose or cracked panels caused by winter ice or wind: Small cracks can worsen overtime as moisture seeps in and freezes, making early repairs key
Clogged gutters: As overflowing water can cause streaks or stains, or even seep into walls
Summer Heat distortion from grills, outdoor heaters or reflective surfaces, like windows: They can cause warping due to vinyl softening at high temperatures
Spray marks from insecticides or pesticides: Depending on the specific formula's base, insecticide sprays can cause staining, discoloration or result in a yellowish tint due to a chemical reaction between the spray and vinyl
Fall Leaves and debris at the base of siding: as trapped moisture, can stain or damage lower panels
Trees or shrubs that could potentially make contact with siding during periods of high winds
Winter Piles of snow against house
Ice melt products degrading the surface of vinyl
All Seasons After storms and periods of strong winds, always check for loose nails or missing or damaged siding panels
